- 7. StoryTown 2022 The Community Services Officer (Arts) will give an update on this year's StoryTown plans, including the funding bid to Arts Council England *for information*.
- 8. Tourism Update The Community Services Officer (Tourism and Events) will give an update on the tourism work being undertaken. The Committee is also asked for its thoughts on a Canine Corsham campaign, promoting Corsham as a dog-friendly tourism destination (report attached) for information and discussion
- 9. Business Support Update A report on the work being done by the Community Services Officer (Tourism and Events) to support local businesses, particularly those in the town centre, is *attached*. The report contains a proposal to replace the Town Council's deteriorating red, white and blue bunting for bunting featuring peacock colours *for information and comment*.
- 10. Strategic Plan Actions for 2022-26 Further to recent Council meetings, the three Committees are being asked to consider what actions to take to deliver the Town Council's Strategic Plan Objectives over the next four years. The attached overview of priorities and objectives will all require actions but the main ones for consideration by this committee are those under the themes of Business and the Economy and Community Wellbeing. Possible actions for all objectives have been drafted and are also attached for consideration.
- 11. The Rhythm Practice Music Therapy The Town Council already helps to fund, along with the Corsham Area Board's Local Youth Network (LYN), music therapy sessions for students at The Corsham School. The impact the therapy has had on those students chosen to take part and the difference the improvement in their behaviour has made to their classmates and the rest of the school, as well as their family lives, has been of huge benefit (see Corsham School Summary 2021/22 and Corsham School Testimonials *attached*). As a result, The Corsham School wishes to continue working with Will Lawton of The Rhythm Practice in 2022/23, supporting more sessions and enabling some group work to take place. The total cost for this is £13,650. The Corsham School will fund £6,000; an application has been made to the LYN for another £5,000 and the Town Council is being asked to fund the remaining £2,650. The LYN application is *attached* by way of explanation. Will Lawton will attend the meeting to answer any questions Councillors may have. Officers have suggested that Town Council funding for The Rhythm Practice could be ring-fenced within Town Council budgets for the next three years *for discussion*.
